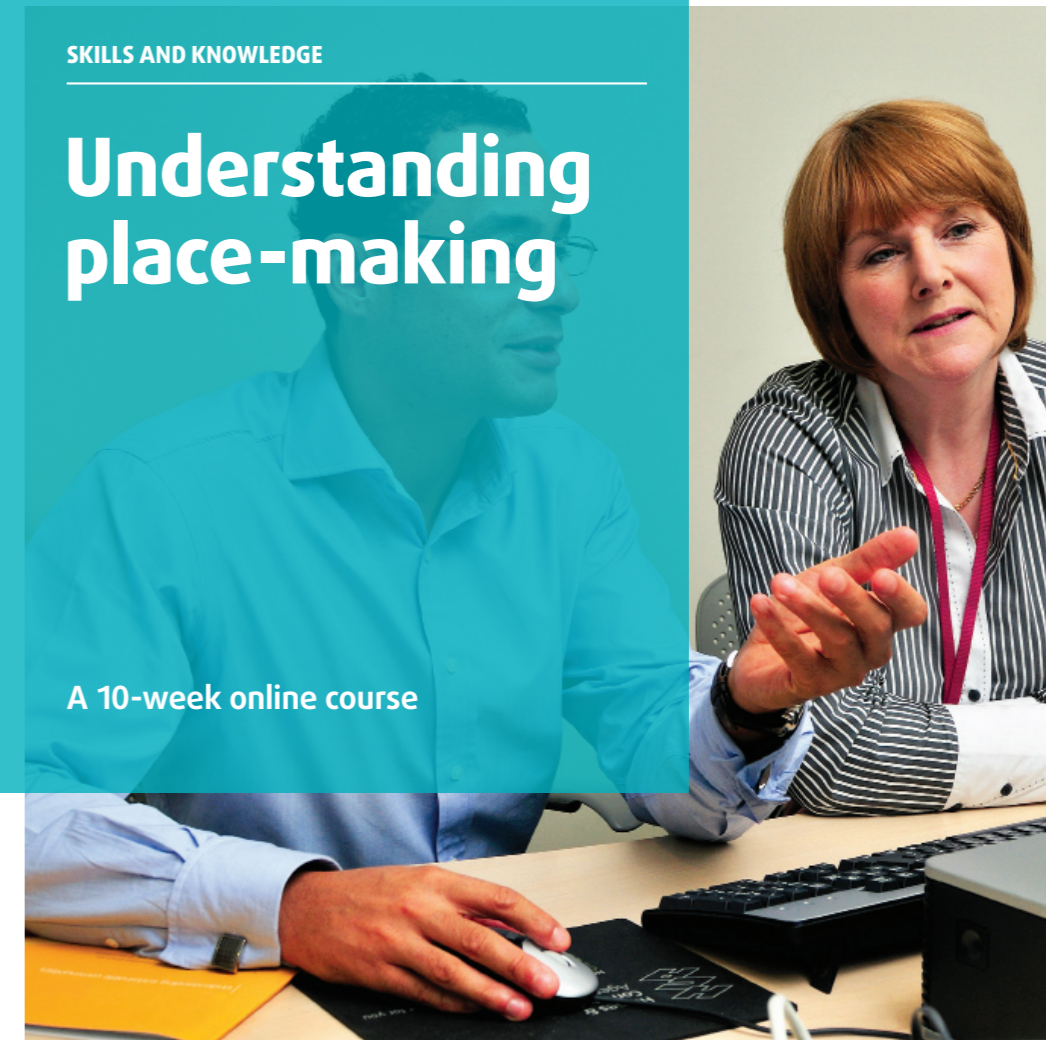

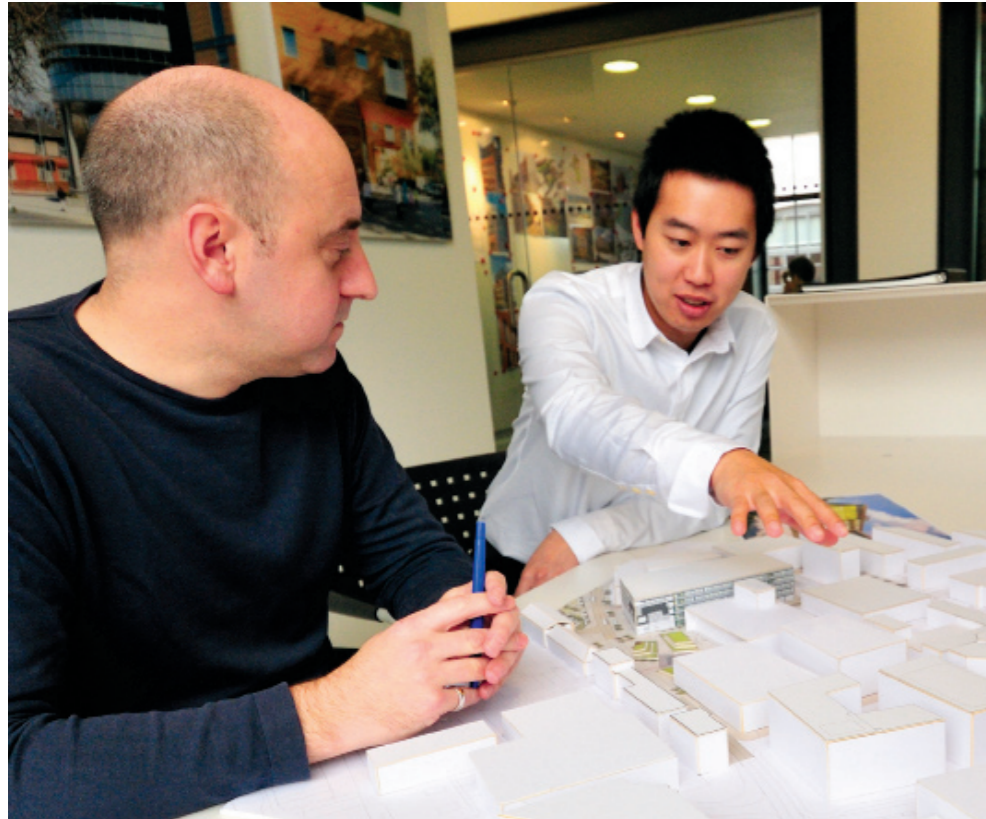

Understanding place-making

WHAT'S COVERED?

There are five workshops that each run over a period of two weeks and you'll be expected to log on for a minimum of six hours for each one.

The workshops are:

- 1 **Introducing sustainable communities:** what terms such as 'community' and 'sustainability' mean and what makes a community sustainable.
- 2 **The policy context:** the factors driving sustainable communities policy and where it fits in terms of other government policies.

3 **Skills for sustainable communities:** the skills needed to create and manage places and how to put them into practice.

4 **Roles and responsibilities:** the core professions and who are the stakeholders; what they do and the different perspectives on sustainable communities.

5 **Putting theory into practice:** how theory behind creating sustainable places can be implemented in a wider housing and regeneration context.

Who's it for?

Participants come from different parts of the industry, such as the built environment, community development and local government.

The course will provide you with an opportunity to learn alongside a diverse range of practitioners, share experiences and knowledge and spread good practice.

How will I be taught?

You'll study in virtual 'workshops' delivered online and backed up by web-based resources, learning materials, videos and case studies. Throughout the course you'll be supported by an experienced and knowledgeable tutor. Your tutor will be on hand to offer advice, guidance and feedback. Before you get started we'll take you through a pre-course assessment process to make sure the course is right for you.

As well as the workshops, you'll also complete an action plan to identify ways to enhance your own skills and knowledge beyond the course.

If you're enthusiastic about online learning and keen to learn more about place-making – this is the course for you.

What commitment do I need?

You'll need access to a computer and the internet and you'll need to commit about three hours a week to interactive learning in the workshops, online discussion and background reading.

There are also deadlines to meet and you'll need to be comfortable with distance learning as well as communicating with people you might never meet.

COURSE INFORMATION

What will I get at the end of it?

All students completing the course receive a certificate endorsed by the HCA. Students can also, at an additional cost, opt to complete an additional workplace based assignment which can lead to achievement of the ILM Level 5 Award in Leadership (Regeneration and Place-making). Course dates

Courses start regularly – usually monthly. After completing a registration form we'll offer you the next available start date, or a later one if you wish. Once you've accepted we'll contact you with details of how to enrol and log on to the course.

Course fees

Private sector – £200 + VAT
